1. IN-PERSON PARTICIPATION

Participants:	Due to the limited in-person capacity of the Inaugural Dialogue venue, in-person participation in the event is moderated by the Organizing Team.
	Only participants registered and approved for in-person participation will be allowed.
	Please do not make travel arrangements before receiving an approval to attend the Inaugural Dialogue in person in Doha.
Sponsored Participants:	Travel, visa, and accommodation expenses of sponsored in-person participants will be covered by the Organizing Team.
	Sponsored participants are required to register for in-person participation <u>here</u> and submit their passport to Jamileh Adwan (Ms.) at <u>jamileh.adwan@undp.org</u> .
	The Inaugural Dialogue will take place on 28-29 October 2024.
Arrival Date:	Registered and approved in-person participants are expected to arrive in Doha on Sunday, 27 October 2024.

Travel:	 Transportation from and to the Hamad International Airport.
	Other in-person participants are expected to organize their travel and cover related expenses themselves.
	Only sponsored in-person participants will be supported with the visa application process.

Visa:	Other in-person participants are expected to arrange their visa themselves.
	Nationalities from 102 countries can enter Qatar visa-free, and all others can apply for an e-visa using the <u>Hayya Platform</u> .

Engagement:	The Inaugural Dialogue will ensure engagement of online participants in the event discussions by enabling them to ask questions in the Zoom chat.

3. LANGUAGES

The Inaugural Dialogue – both in person and online – will be conducted in Arabic with simultaneous interpretation into English.

4. SECURITY

Zero Tolerance to Harassment and Retaliation:	 The Inaugural Dialogue, its Co-organizers, and Organizing Team are committed to enabling an event in which every participant – both inperson and online – can participate in an inclusive, respectful, and safe environment. 
